

Second Annual Pin Show, Swap, and Sale
Saturday, June 12, 2010
In the “Barn”, 748 Wiler Road, Hilton, NY

Jim and Donna Schiebel will host a swap in their Lions museum affectionately called the “Barn”. Table space, morning coffee, and a picnic lunch will be available.

Thousands of pins will be offered for sale with hundreds costing \$1.50 or less. The “barn” now has over 850 riker mount boxes of pins representing all the pin trading clubs and the majority of the countries with Lions membership. Memorabilia from 49 past international presidents are included along with such items as the Fenton bells from Ohio, towels from Georgia, assorted dishes from New Jersey and Pennsylvania, copper items from Utah, a bell from the Swiss Lions and a drum from African Lions.

The general plan is to be open for trading from 8 am to 5 pm but the “barn” has had two Lions Club’s dinner meetings, a Sunday brunch and numerous individual tours. PIP Kay Fukushima said that this was the biggest display in North America although several Lions have larger pin collections. Call to arrange tours.
