LITPC 25th Anniversary

Since the LITPC was "born" in 1973, we would have normally celebrated the 25th anniversary during the LCI Convention in Birmingham, England in 1998. However, because of the reduced LITPC membership attendance in England, the 25th celebration was moved to 1999 in San Diego. President **Bob Meyer**, Tennessee, provided LCI with sufficient detail to show that the LITPC would no doubt have a larger than usual delegation, and LCI responded by assigning the LITPC with one of the very nicest hotels (the Hanalei) in the city. Under Third Vice President **Chuck Weldon's** leadership, the LITPC produced a memorable 25th Anniversary Party that featured the "retirement" of two of the most involved and beloved members this organization has ever had. PDG **Ed Fogelman** and his wife, **Dorothy**, provided most of the administrative details for the LITPC from the beginning in 1973 up until the present 1999. Dorothy and Ed Fogelman, two people who became living legends within the pin trading community, "retired" from all of the positions that they held in the LITPC. This was a highlight of the LITPC 25th Anniversary gathering during the 1999 LCI convention in San Diego, California. Outgoing President, Bob Meyer of Tennessee, was the "mover and shaker" for this party and, as a real party animal, gave the Fogelman's a night to remember. Everyone got dressed up and let Dorothy and Ed know just how much they loved and respected them and how much they appreciated all that they have done for the LITPC since the beginning in 1973. Ed was one of our Founding Members, and Dorothy was right there with him all the time. As a matter of fact, if the truth be known, she was the one who did most of the administrative work and made Ed look like a superman. Although Ed wasn't the first Secretary or Treasurer that we had, he certainly held those two positions longer than anyone to date in our history. He would serve two terms as the Secretary and then flip over to the Treasurer's job for a two-year term. This arrangement continued for years and it provided us with the continuity that we needed. Dorothy was the keeper of the membership roster for years and, believe it or not, she produced a membership roster each year without the benefit of a computer. This wonderful couple spent most every waking hour during our many conventions and get-togethers just taking care of the multitude of details that are required for a smooth operation. In the latter stages of their tenure, they took Past President Bill Smith of Virginia under their wings and then turned most of the behind the scenes work over to him when they retired. They have probably worried about that ever since. Anyway, Dorothy and Ed Fogelman will forever be a part of the history of the LITPC. When the party was over, Ed made the comment that "we'll probably never be back and I'm really going to miss this bunch of folks." No one really believed that this would be the last time we would see Ed. We're still waiting for Dorothy to make at least one more appearance.

The 30th Anniversary Farty - Denver, Colorado, 2003




