There are variations of most of the pins in the Rough Rider set from 1988 through 1991 that are different shades of color as a result of the amount of epoxy on the face of the pin. Some are almost yellow. The pin Shown above as 1991-1 is due to the removal of the epoxy.

In the interest of showing not only the recognized pins issued by a Multiple District, we feel that the serious collector is interested in those pins that have become highly collectible over the years. The pins on this page were actually issued by a PDG in another state. He solicited support for the issues from a number of traders in various states on the basis that North Dakota could not afford them. He selected "key" individuals within a state and told them that they would have "exclusive rights" for the issues within their state. When the pins were issued, it was discovered that there were in fact more than one individual in a given state and that there were numerous individuals all over the U.S.A. with socalled "exclusive rights". It is not known to this date how many of each pin were made but it can be safely stated that there must have been large quantities because many traders have them in their collections.
