FAST DAY. This was a day of public fasting and prayer and was traditionally observed in the New England states of the U.S.A. It had its origin in the days of prayer and repentance proclaimed in the early days of the American colonies by Royal Governors. It was observed by church attendance, fast, and abstinence from secular activities.

Fast Day had lost its significance as a religious holiday by the late 19th century. It was abolished by Massachusetts in 1894 and shortly thereafter by Maine. It continued in Hew Hampshire until 1991, when it was dropped and replaced with the January CIVIL RIGHTS DAY, which in 1999, became MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. DAY.
